NEWSLETTER JUNE, 2020

I hope this newsletter finds all my friends in the fishing fraternity well. After being locked up for a couple of months, I know I for one, was rearing to drop a line in anywhere, but the nearest water where we could catch anything is about 70 km away. So I was isolated to the house and didn't go anywhere. Mind you, I did get a few of those jobs done I had been putting off for a long time.

Just in case you are not all aware of what happened when COVID-19 first became a problem and it was declared a pandemic, I began to wonder whether we could hold the National Titles or not, not knowing the time the virus would last. I had to make a decision, so I contacted every state president and asked their opinion and generally it was felt we should not go ahead in 2020. I think at this stage the Good Lord was on our side.

I chose a date in August 2021, a bit earlier this time - 4th to 17th of August. This should put the tides just where we want them. As far as we have heard, people have had few problems transferring their deposits on their rental properties over to 2021. Some have received their money back. However, it has made it a little difficult as I like to be organised well in advance of the festivities. I had the lanyards, metal badges, cloth patches and cloth badges made this year, so they will have 2020 on them, not 2021.

I believe I've told you all before that we have purchased all the trophies. I hired and paid for a storage unit to hold these until the titles this year. At this stage, they won't make it up there in 2020. About 50% of the perpetual trophies have been returned and they have been polished beautifully by our good friend, Roslyn Lythall, and she can't wait to get her hands on the rest of them.

The fishing program for the titles will be the same as it was previously, the only difference being, we will be starting both offshore competitions at the boat ramp at 5.30 am; all other competition sign-ons will be at headquarters. All weigh-ins commence at 3.00 pm with the day prizes being presented at 4.00 pm except when there is a function on at night, where they will be presented at the start of the evening.

We spent some time at the Discovery Coast and have the social program completed. I will not go through it all in this newsletter, just the main points for you to ponder. Of course we will start with the Welcome Night which will be at Headquarters and we expect to start around 5.00 pm, after all the pleasantries of the opening ceremony are complete. It is normal for a few photos of teams to be taken at that time also, so there will be time for this.

On the first day of fishing there will be a welcome morning tea for the non-fisher folk at the 1770 Getaway Garden Cafe. There will be no cost for this gathering. An activity has been organised for these folk every day, so there is no chance of them becoming bored.

Saturday, August 7th, a social evening at the Agnes Waters Tavern has been organised. We have booked a comedian who calls a little trivia as well. Cost to come to the event \$10.00 per person. You can get your drinks at the bar and order your own meal. Sunday, August 8th, is a lay day when AAA AGM and Federal Executive Meeting will be held. However, we have organised a great day for those not involved in the meetings - a visit to a few of the hot spots at Agnes Water - the Museum, Tea Tree Forest, a special tasting at the local distillery to try the Strawberry

Splash and Baffle Beer, and the Local Markets.

Our second Social is on Wednesday, August 11th, which will also happen at the Agnes Water Tavern, where we are going to introduce you to gold fish races. It takes a bit to set up and I believe some of you may be involved. The cost to attend the event will be \$10 per person. If you want to have a wager on the side, I believe there will be someone to look after you. The meal arrangements are the same as beforebeer at the bar and buy your own meal.

Thursday, August 12th, is a lay day and it is the day we intend taking the LARC up to Bustard Head. I can thoroughly recommend this full day trip as we have done it recently. The cost is \$150.00 per head, but it is one of those things you should include on your 'bucket list', and we will get a group discount. The LARC leaves near the boat ramp and heads across the water and up the beach, accompanied by a running commentary on the flora and fauna of the area. Just before crossing Jenny Lind Creek, they stop for morning tea at their specially built area, where we have billy tea and some delicacies.

After crossing the creek, the LARC climbs the headland to the lighthouse and all its buildings. There is a wealth of history in this area and you could spend a long time going through it all, especially the cemetery. One of the delights I had was going sand boarding down a hill. We are provided with a delicious lunch, and all too soon it is back home. It is a 7 hour adventure and is highly recommended.

The next night we have set aside is Saturday 14th August and we hope that South Australia will give us a presentation on what they intend for their titles.

Sunday, 15th August, tour of the Bundaberg Distillery and perhaps the Macadamia Factory. We will go by bus from Agnes. The Macadamia Factory does not open on a Sunday at this stage so I will have to use some influence. I will let you know the price of this as soon as it is available.

Tuesday 17th August will be the Presentation Evening to be held at the Agnes Waters Tavern starting at 4.00 pm. The reason we are starting so early is so we are not presenting trophies way into the night. Cost will be \$50.00 per person. Safe journey home!
